Revision to Part 2: Program Guidelines, “Eligible Applicants,” p. 9 of 37

Currently reads: Using the criteria above, campuses will then be ranked from highest priority to lowest priority according to the following order. Funding will be distributed from highest ranking campuses to the lowest ranking campuses until all funds available have been awarded.

Corrected to read: Using the criteria above, campuses will then be ranked from highest priority to lowest priority according to the following order. Funding will be distributed from highest ranking campuses to the lowest ranking campuses until all funds available have been awarded. Of all campuses to be awarded, priority will be to fund 80% of the campuses (approximately 40-64 campuses) having an enrollment at or above 400 students and to fund 20% of the campuses (approximately 10-16 campuses) having less than 400 students enrolled. Of the applications submitted and eligible for funding, if either group, campuses having enrollment above 400 student enrollment or campuses having enrollment below 400 students, does not constitute 80% or 20% of the applications received, respectively, the remaining funds will be used to fund additional campuses in the other category.

Revision to Part 2: Program Guidelines, “Key Practices, bullet item 2. a,” p. 15 of 37

Corrected to read: Local instructional coach: A dedicated coach who is a member of the campus staff and who must focus exclusively on coaching. It is expected that a local instructional coach would be ~~relieved~~ relieved of all classroom teaching duties during the time ~~they serve~~ he or she serves as an instructional coach in order to focus exclusively on coaching during the grant period.

Revision to Part 2: Program Guidelines, “Application Funding,” p. 21 of 37

Currently reads: Approximately \$23,500,000 is available for funding Algebra Readiness, Cycle 1 grants during the January 1, 2010, through May 31, 2012, project period. It is anticipated that 50 to 80 projects will be funded during the first cycle of this grant. The maximum award per campus is \$235,000.

where the number of students enrolled is at or above 400 are eligible to apply for up to \$235,000. Campuses where the number of students enrolled is below 400 are eligible to apply for funding based on a per-student allocation of \$450. (The number of students refers to the number of students in grades 6, 7, and 8, or grades 7 and 8, as identified in the 2008 PEIMS fall enrollment.)
