SPP/APR Overview	David Carrales presented an overview of the SPP/APR submitted on February 2, 2009, to the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) at the U.S. Department of Education to the new CAC members. CAC Minutes	Minutes were reviewed by committee members. A motion was made to accept the minutes without changes for the April 1, 2009, CAC meeting by Sherri Hammack. Motion was seconded by Julia Erwin and minutes were approved by all members present.
State of the State	<p>Phyllis Gandy discussed the stimulus money and the application process for LEAs to apply for the funds. USDE is encouraging LEAs to “think outside the box” when developing programs/training to improve results for students with disabilities using the stimulus money. Data collection is a key component of this process. Further guidance will be forth coming from the federal government.</p> <p>Barbara Kaatz reviewed the bills that were passed during the 81st legislative session and the implications for TEA. David Carrales discussed the determinations process. Texas received a level of Needs Assistance this year, an improvement over 2008. He also discussed Restraint and Seclusion issues. Texas has State Laws and Commissioners Rules regarding this issue, and collects data annually. Districts have this data available to them in order to proactively address this problem.</p>
Quarterly Complaints Investigations/Due Process Decisions Update	Cindy Swain gave an overview of the Facilitated IEP Project as a way of assuring positive outcomes of the ARD process. She gave a summary of the most recent

due process hearing decisions from January to June 2009.

PBMAS/PMI

Rachel Harrington addressed the principles that comprise the Performance Based Monitoring Analysis System (PBMAS). The Division of Performance-Based Monitoring is responsible for developing the system which is an automated data system that reports annually on the performance of school districts and charter schools in selected program areas including special education.

Judy Struve explained the purpose of the Program Monitoring Intervention (PMI) Division and reviewed the role of PMI with the Division of IDEA Coordination.
