State of the State

Kathy Clayton presented the State of the State by sharing the following information:

- Discipline Summit was very productive. The diverse perspectives of participants facilitated rich feedback and will become a model for future meetings.
- At NASDE (National Association of State Directors of Special Education) Meeting discussions were held on the reauthorization of IDEA, Federal Funding, Unified Systems with General Education and Special Education Aligning, and Professional development for teachers.
- Rtl State Guidance is available on the Curriculum website
- AYP ratings have negatively impacted several districts. This is a growth opportunity to refocus and review procedures and training.
- PBMS (Program Based Monitoring System) structure was discussed. PMI (Program Monitoring Intervention Division) would be available to give the committee a more in depth overview of the process. The Policy Team is continuing to establish clear definitions within the guidance document regarding Indicator 15.

Overview of the Discipline Summit

The major goal of the Discipline Summit was to get local perspective.

The following gaps were identified:

- Discipline and Behavior not measured in a useful way that is usable for districts
- No Discipline or Behavior TEKS
- Collaboration with all police
- Training and technical assistance
- Coordination between all programs
- Coordination of the resources (knowing what is available)

The following solutions were identified:

- Create Behavior Academies like Reading Academies
- Coaching Model- Ongoing teaching assistance
- Teacher Ready Materials (User Friendly)
- Training on how to use data at the local level
- Maintaining positive parent relationships
